The successful candidate will have field experience in implementing development or conservation projects or activities. The candidate will have a strong interest in the nature conservation and/or development and improving its practice, and inter-disciplinary collaborations.

Communication and relational skills are required. The candidate will help co-organizing some courses. French and English language proficiency is expected (French is the predominant teaching language at UNIL).

Assets for good candidates include: experience in field research, teaching qualifications, independence and initiative, and synergies with supervisors' specific interests and field areas. For overseas projects, experience in the region and related language skills are required.
