CPT-training with Eijkelkamp

Participants from ENGAGE: Edoardo Carraro, Robert Kanta, Philipp Marr, Benedikt Müller Advancing subsurface investigations is crucial for landslide research. In collaboration with Royal Eijkelkamp, we conducted a field training session on the new Cone Penetration Testing (CPT) device of the Universität Wien.

In the last few days, we focused on a comprehensive understanding of CPT principles and applications and hands-on experience conducting cone penetration tests under real field conditions

This was a great opportunity to bridge theory and practice, improving our ability to characterize subsurface conditions in landslide-prone areas. A big thank you to everyone involved for making this a valuable experience.

NoeDRILL / Deep drilling

After a winter break, the deep drilling continued and was finally completed on Monday, March 17, 2025, with the installation of 40m inclinometer tubes. Robert Kanta and Edoardo Carraro will install the Measurand SAA inclinometer chain on the 21st and connect it to the NoeSLIDE server to obtain data every 5 minutes. Due to the geological conditions, we expect to obtain very informative data that will allow us to create detailed landslide models and take NoeSLIDE long term monitoring to a new level.

PARATUS

Ongoing work explores the interrelation of multi-hazard risks, particularly in the Alps application site. Currently, scenarios are being developed to analyse the potential impacts of blockages on the region. Additionally, various methodologies are being employed to assess the area's susceptibility to landslide processes.

- The core facility eSurfLAB has new equipment, welcome the **Eijkelkamp Compact Crawler 200 kN**. This cone penetration testing is suitable for obtaining information about the structure of a subsurface, for example, a slope. In addition to providing strength profiles at different depths (allowing conclusions about density, consistency, etc.), it can also yield information about the maximum penetration depth (solid rock boundary). It will be used to further explore the subsurface conditions at the three sites of the eSurfLAB.
