Founded in 1885 the Department of Geography and Regional Research is the oldest and biggest geography department in Austria. It is home to more than 90 researchers as well as general staff in 9 working Groups, and 3,000 students.

The praedoctoral researcher will contribute to the theory-led, evidence-based and policyrelevant research of the group Economic Geography on innovation-based socio-economic and socio-technical sustainability transitions. Together with experienced key investigators, the jobholder will work in the project **"Regional industrial transitions under multiscalar exnovation pressures" (RITMEP)** funded by the Austrian Climate Research Programme (ACRP, 15th call). In addition, the jobholder is expected to complete a cumulative doctoral dissertation in three years under the supervision of Professor Michaela Trippl.

The RITMEP project addresses the formidable challenges that regions face due to the transformation of carbon-intensive industries and the exit from unsustainable economic practices. For regions with significant employment in emission-intensive industries (e.g. cement, chemicals, paper and printing, transport and logistics), how to decarbonise these industries and construct just and sustainable regional futures is a critical policy question that calls for scientific evidence. RITMEP seeks to understand these regional decarbonisation pathways through qualitative empirical research based on semi-structured interviews, an ongoing content analysis of the national and regional discourse, and co-development workshops in a comparative set of case studies in three Austrian regions. By contributing to a deeper understanding of place-based decarbonisation pathways, RITMEP strives to advance the state of knowledge in the field of geography of sustainability transitions through ground-breaking conceptual and empirical research.
